VANCE HAS SIGNED UP

Brooklyn Pitcher Accepts \$15,000 Salary This Year

CLEARWATER, Fla:, Feb. 25:-Dazzy Vance, star hurier of the Brooklyn Dodgers, deserted the ranks of the hold-outs yesterday when he signed up for another year with the club.

While no figures were announced, it is understood that Vance will rereive a salary of \$15,000 for the year. Last year he received \$23,000 and was holding out for \$17,000 this season. A few days ago he turned down \$12,000.

Several other members of the team are still holding out.
