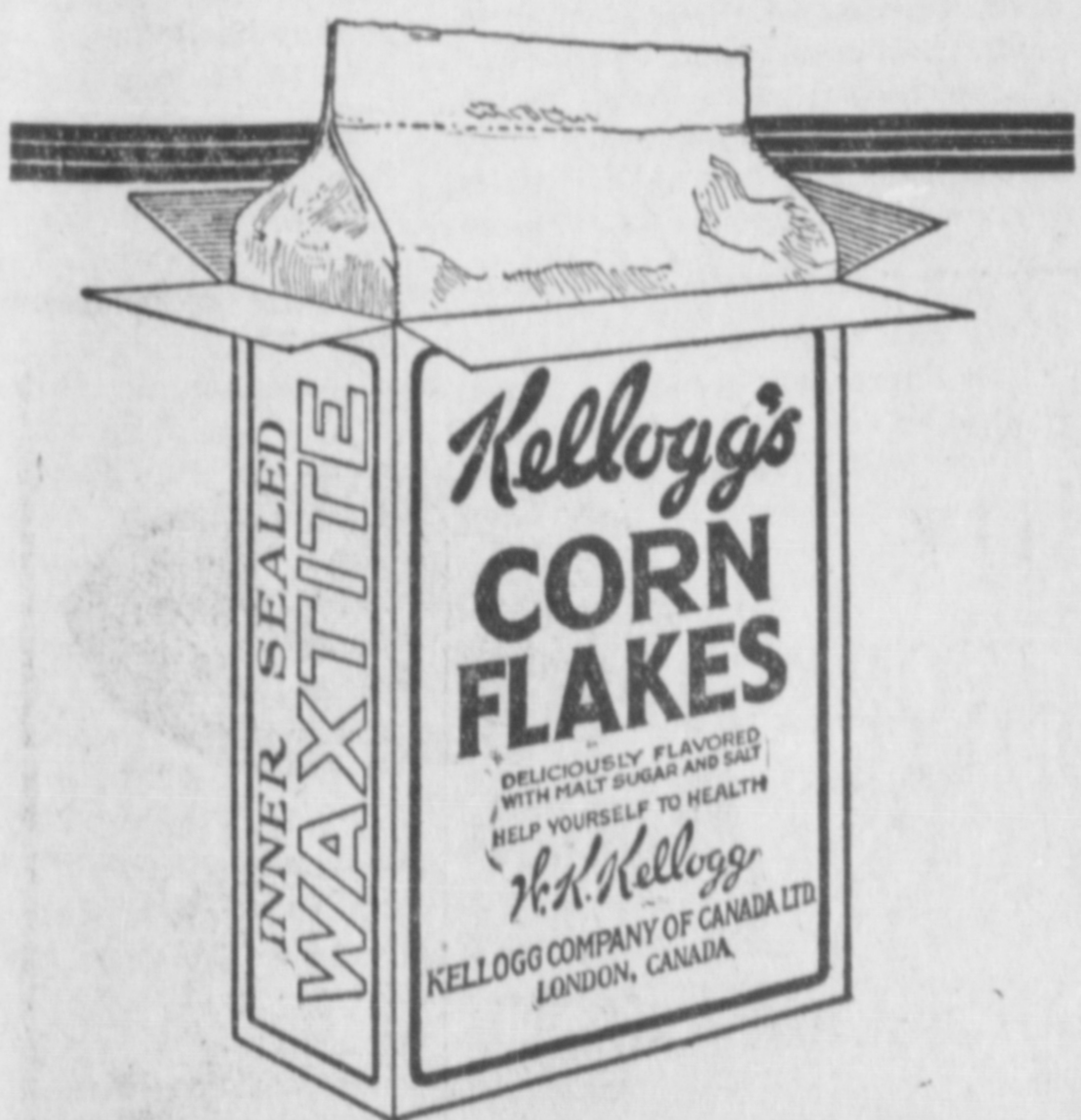

A. H. Waddington of the Forest Branch service returned to the city on the Prince George this morning from a trip to the Ocean Falls district on official duties.

A letter from Norman Baker, civil service commissioner for the province, read at last night's school board meeting, enclosed teachers' superannuation forms which it was requested be distributed among the teachers.

Fred Coram has assumed his duties as purser of the steamer Prince George for the summer after having been stationed ashore for the past five years in the service of Canadian National Steamships. He was formerly a well known officer of the company's ships.

The following is from the Twenty Years Ago column of the Vancouver Province: "The first train over the newly completed section of the Grand Trunk Pacific from Vanarsdol to Skeena Crossing will be operated Saturday from Prince Rupert," said W. E. Duperow, general agent of the passenger department of the railway, who is in Vancouver today.

A communication from E. B. Baker referred to the school board last evening an account of \$12.50 from the Prince Rupert General Hospital covering treatment given his young son who sustained a head injury recently in a fall against concrete steps at Booth Memorial School. While Mr. Baker will be informed that the board is prepared to take no responsibility for the payment of the account, the board agreed to approach the hospital authorities with a view to having the charge modified.

Inaugurating the company's schedule of summer tourist sailings to Alaska, C.N.R. steamer Prince George, Capt. Neil McLean, arrived in port ahead of time at 10:30 this morning from Vancouver. Powell River and Ocean Falls and is sailing at 3 o'clock this afternoon for Skagway and other northern points whence she will return here at 7 o'clock next Monday morning and sail at 4 o'clock that afternoon for the south. The vessel has on board a good-sized list of passengers including quite a number of round trip tourists. The company's next Alaska sailing will be taken by the steamer Prince Robert which is due here Saturday northbound.
