



today what will make new men out of humanity torn by many fears, and pulled here and there by conflicting desires and passions; certainly it cannot be steam, electricity or the discovery of new physical forces, such as the much talked of release of atomic energy. No, it must be a new motive power, redeeming and sublimating the soulstuff and the strange bundle of instincts and impulses making up man. Apart from that, these other things spell destruction on a vast and awful scale. The power of the Christian religion, which is Christ in the heart of man, alone can do this, for we should then have a new creature without which we cannot have a new world.

In regard to the reformed society or Utopia pictured by reformers, based on co-operative effort, for the good of all, our older economists have said, yes, very fine, but it does not work.

Today we see that the old selfish individualism which seeks to appropriate the benefits of newfound powers and resources, does not work. This is because the ruling, directing motive, amid much that is admirable and kindly, is acquisitive. If it were true that the better order were impossible because selfishness is the mainspring. of human conduct, then the Christian ideal of the Kingdom of God is impossible, bankrupt, and Jesus, above all, misled.

One thing that Christ claims to do is to bring men within the operation of a new motive, the law of love. Without this there can be no progress toward the age of brotherhood. Give man a new motive and you have a new creature, recreated homes and communities, and a new world. Continue under the old motives and instincts, with men seeking wealth, regardless of the wrong done to others, corrupting governments and fattening on practices which batten on the unguarded appetites of men, at the same time fostering ancient rivalries, and you will have another phase of hell on earth.
