New York Yankees Shut-Out Senators-Pittsburgh Pirates Move Into Fourth Place

WASHINGTON, May 27:-New York Yankees shut out Washington Senators in the opening game of a series here yesterday to assume a commanding lead of four full games at the top of the American League standing.

In the National League Boston Braves lost to the cellar-dwelling Phillies in a slugfest and fell back half a game in their campaign for first place against the Chicago Cubs. The Cubs, idle yesterday, have a lead of one game and a half.

Pittsburg Pirates continued their winning streak and defeated the Cincinnati Reds in a close game to advance to fourth place ahead of the St. Louis Cardinals, who were idle, and the New York Giants, who lost to Brooklyn Dodgers.
