

FINE RESIDENCE TO GRACE FOURTH AVENUE

Designed for Frank Mobley and to be Erected Immediately on Site Near Young St.—Interesting New Features Planned—House Will Cost \$8,000

Another beautiful residence is to be added to Prince Rupert's already excellent list of fine homes. F. Mobley is to build immediately on Fourth Avenue near Young Street. Plans for the house by W. L. Barker provide for a handsome residence of two storeys with basement the cost of which will not be less than \$8000.

Richly Designed

In exterior appearance the house will be rather different from the ordinary design. Doorways and balconies are to be enriched in substantial manner with heavy timber archways and mouldings. Both from back and front the house will look attractive, and the interior is to be specially so.

From the main entrance opens a spacious reception hall with polished timbering and ceiling

beams. Off this lead the entrances to dining room, living room, and den. Richly wainscotted, and with beam ceiling the dining-room is a handsome one. The fireplace in the den is designed of specially fired bricks of rich rough surface, and occupies a kindly corner position. The living room is planned for comfort and inviting appearance.

Convenient Kitchen

A Dutch kitchen planned for the greatest possible convenience of the cook is a feature of the residence. Everything required in the kitchen will be within reach with the minimum of trouble. Panelled presses and cabinets are to line the walls, and coolness even when the stove is working its hardest is assured by the ventilation arranged for. From

the basement to the kitchen runs a fuel hoist, and ash shoots are provided in the fireplaces. Modern heating apparatus in the basement will take care of the comfort of the house in cold weather, and here too, are equipped a convenient laundry and drying rooms.

Two stairways lead to the upper floor which is designed for spacious bedrooms, and a pretty sewing room. One stairway leads from the kitchen, the other from the reception hall. Most modern is the fitting planned for the bathroom which is on the upper flat.

Balconies and verandahs are well adapted to the conditions of this coast, and command the finest views for which residences in Prince Rupert are famed. Mr. Mobley hopes to occupy his new home by the fall. Contracts for its erection are now being let.

Jury at Victoria Find Him Not Guilty of Charge of Shooting with Intent at the Kelly's Cut Incident.

"Buckavitch is pronounced not guilty by jury. Hope for more victories."

The above telegram received this morning from Mr. W. E. Williams of Williams & Manson, counsel for the defence of the strikers on trial at Victoria, was received this morning. Milan Vuckavitch, the man referred to, was charged with shooting with intent to kill. His was one of the more serious cases, and it came first on the docket for the Prince Rupert cases.

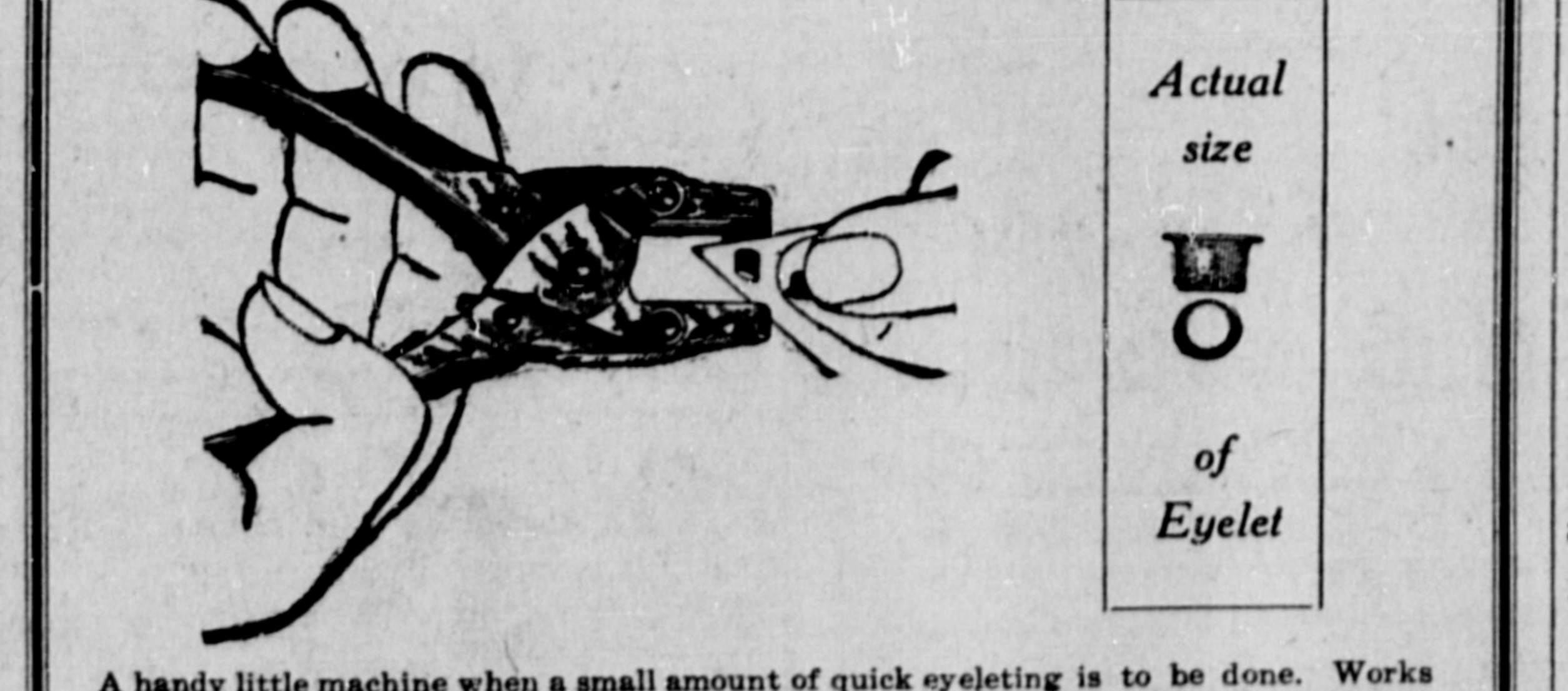
