IDENTITY PRESUMED

Skeleton Found at Balmoral Cannery Believed That of Werner Nilson, Drowned at Falls River

The skeleton, which was found at the end of last week under Balmoral cannery wharf near the confluence of the Ecstall and Skeena Rivers, is presumed by the authorities to have been that of Werner Nilson, one of four men who lost their lives on March 26, 1930, when a small skiff in which they were riding was caught in a whirlpool in Falls River and swept over the lower falls into the Ecstall River. The four men were employed on power house construction work by the Power Corporation of Canada. An inquiry was held this week at Port Essington by Coroner N. A. Watt and the skeleton was buried Thursday. 84

This is the second body that has been found, that of Larry Ward having been picked up off Digby Island in May, 1930. No trace was ever found of the other two men. 84
