The lines of reorganization HOLD-UP IN been considered definitely but it is taken for granted that some of the present cabinet will retire from politics during the next year or eighteen months.

Hon. William Atkinson, minister of agriculture, is said to desire the repose of public life and Hon. Joshua Hinchliffe, minister of education, has been suffering indifferent health for some time. It is safe to say that the cabinet will not be as large as it is now when it appeals for a second term of power.
