

Raw Materials

"There is an abundance of raw materials, the species of which lend themselves to that particular industry owing to the large percentage of spruce they contain and the accessibility which insures cheap delivery of wood and logs you are not paying any premium judgment would insure for all time. The operations should for it. include a medium capacity sawmill for the manufacture of rough clears principally, so that could be sorted, taking out the No. 1 and No. 2 clears only. I presume you are aware that clears spruce bring the highest price of any of the clears on the Pacific Coast, ranging in price from \$25 this latter price being for airplane mill below a No. 2 grade would go over to the pulp operation and in this way eliminate waste, getting the maximum in quality and quantity of the operation, which in the final analysis gives you the greatest value in dollars and percentage of profits.

Location

"The location for the mill, owing to the abundance of raw materia as stated before, is most suitable for the industry, the best on the Pacific Coast. You can draw a circle of 100 miles around or from Prince Rupert, using this point for your axis, and you include the greatest volume of suitable timber for the manufacture of high grade pulp and paper, viz: spruce, balsam; and hemlock, that there is left available on the North American continent. 
