PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given to the presence of the said electors at the City of Prince Rupert, that I require the presence of the said electors at the City Clerk's Office, in the City Hall, City of Prince Rupert, on Monday, the 11th day of January, 1932, at twelve o'clock noon for the purpose of electing persons to represent them as Mayor and Aldermen and School Trustees.  
The mode of nomination of candidates shall be as follows:  
The candidates shall be nominated in writing; the writing shall be subscribed by two electors of the municipality as proposer and seconder, and shall be delivered to the Returning Officer at any time between the date of the notice and two p.m. of the day of nomination, the said writing may be in the form numbered 3 in the Schedule of the "Municipal Elections Act" and shall state the names, residence and occupation or description of each person proposed, in such manner as to sufficiently identify each candidate, and in the event of a poll being necessary, such poll shall be opened on the 14th day of January, 1932, at the Police Court, City Hall, City of Prince Rupert, from the hour of 8 o'clock a.m. to the hour of 8 o'clock p.m. of which every person is hereby required to take notice and govern himself accordingly.
