"Dividends of a Family Corporation shall be subject to taxation only to the extent that the dividends are in excess of the amount

For ex- afternoon. and having, say, three shareholders, is not taxable in the hands of the company, but is taxable in the hands of the shareholders according to their interests as shareholders. Dividends of such a company, days in excess of what would be the net taxable income of the company, are taxable in the hands of the shareholders, but only to the extent of such excess. That is to say, the company pays no tax: the shareholders are taxed according to their proportionate interest in the net profits of the company, and, if dividends are paid, also on the amount by which such dividends exceed the amount of net profits on which they have already been taxed. There is therefore no duplication of tax.

By registering as a Family Corporation in the manner provided by the act, the members have the advantage of being taxed at a lower rate than the ten per cent charged on company profits, and can also claim, as individuals, higher exemptions than are allowed' to com-

As this seems rather an unpropitious time to suggest to an already heavily loaded taxpayer that he is being taxed twice on the same income by the same government, the foregoing information is supplied to you for use as you see fit.


