

the 19th century and well into the 30th. When Dr. Patterson was born in the West Barony of Kilsyth, Representative of British and For-George IV was on the throne. When he came to Canada at the age of 27 Confederation was still 10 years off. Dr. Patterson was ordained into the Church of Scotland ministry at Dunoon and actually came to settle in Prince Edward Island.

Helped Children The Fresh Air Fund of Montreal was founded by Dr. Patterson and a number of church workers. Beginning in a small way it provides ways and means to send poor mothers and children to the country during the summer and now has permanent headquarters at Chambly, Que. Until he was more than 100 years old Dr. Patterson regularly attended the Fresh Air Fund's annual

The honorary degree of doctor of divinity was conferred on him in 1915. For a number of years he was the oldest minister in Canada.

Dr. Patterson was always interviewed by the Montreal press on his birthday after he reached the century mark. He could give no particular reason for his remarkable longevity. He used to testify that he had worked very hard durling his lifetime. He was a lifelong teetotaller but until he was more than 80 used to smoke in modera-

Dr. Patterson married in 1860 Rosina, daughter of Dr. Francis Sherriff of Huntington, who predeceased him.


