### Pope Uses His Influence in Cause

ROME, March 20:-As a result of conferences held here between Premier Mussolini and Premier Ramsay MacDonald of Britain it was decided to make an effort to form a four-power treaty for the peace and security of Europe, the principals being Great Britain, Germany, Italy and France. Chancellor Hitler has already agreed to the scheme and Mr. MacDonald is now in France laying the proposal before the French government with a view to securing the acceptance of that country.

Under the scheme Germany would be allowed to increase her army to a parity with that of Italy and France, both of which would be reduced.

The proposal for the scheme was made by Premier Mussolini, who also enlisted the support of Chancellor Hitler Government Notified No Relief of Germany.

The Pope has taken a keen interest in the present situation and has strongly urged the statesmen of Europe to get together and prevent any further war, which might arise from the present unsettled state of affairs.

The need of some such move has been accentuated of late by the trouble in the Polish Corridor and by the financial crisis in Austria where the situation is said to be serious. United States, it is understood would look with favor on any scheme which would insure the peace of the world at the present time.

It has been suggested here that a revision of the Versailles Treaty is likely to follow the signing of such a treaty.

The official Italian announcement Sunday said: "Collaboration of the four powers" was proposed in Premier Mussolini's plan but no details were made public.

Premier MacDonald called the working out of the Mussolini plan as "an evolutionary process." "The proposition we have in mind is to create conditions of real peace which will arise from the satisfaction of various nations who are in a position to disturb it. We are not out for an imposed peace but for an agreed peace," Mr. MacDonald said. He declared the reported summaries of the Mussolini plan despatched abroad were "sheer imagination."

Empress of Russia Standing By Until Oregon Maru Arrives on Scene Near Aleutians

(Canadian Press Despatch) SEATTLE, March 20:-Listing badly because her lumber cargo has shifted, the Japanese freighter Canadian Seigneur, fought stormy weather in mid-Pacific today with at least one vessel standing by. The Empress of Russia, racing to the scene in reply to the freighter's message of Sunday to "hurry quickly," had reached the vessel's position later in the day and last night reported it had sighted the stricken craft.

A message said the Seigneur was listed about twenty-five degrees. The Empress was standing by awaiting the arrival of the Oregon Maru. The Seigneur left Gray's Harbor on March 2 with a crew of 45 men and gave her position as 4 5north, and 161.35 east, about two thousand miles west of here and several hundred miles south of the Alcutian Islands,
