

PETITION

TO THE HONORABLE THE HOUSE OF COMMONS OF CANADA,
IN PARLIAMENT ASSEMBLED:

WE, THE UNDERSIGNED CITIZENS of the Great Dominion of Canada, being a free and independent people, in whom resides the right of self determination, do hereby vigorously protest against the action of the Radio Commission of Canada in censoring or attempting to censor and exclude from public broadcast radio lectures on matters pertaining to the Bible and of public interest, and particularly the lectures of J. F. Rutherford, pertaining to divine prophecy. We have sincere persons claim that the Bible prophecies apply particularly to our day and bear direct relationship to the present world distress, and disclose God's remedy for relief. We are entitled to hear these questions publicly discussed free from all censor, otherwise our freedom is taken away. Those who object, or who may be offended by such lectures, may turn their radio dials and decline to hear.

We, therefore, demand that the Dominion Parliament take immediate action, removing from the Radio Commission the power to censor, hinder or prevent such lectures by radio and that the people be left free to determine what they may or may not hear. Men of world-wide repute and eminently qualified to explain the Bible, such as we believe Rutherford is, can be helpful to the people and we demand that our radio stations be permitted to publicly broadcast his lectures. The question is: Shall the people continue to enjoy freedom or shall a few men deprive them of their God-given rights?

Salmon Trolling About to Begin in Real Earnest
Soon—Speed of Salmon Discussed—Activities Around Cow Bay

The larger trolling boats are now starting to place in position the long slender poles in their boats and overhauling gear in preparation for the forth coming season. Trolling is the sportiest of all commercial fishing. Watching patiently for a strike and playing carefully with the king of salmon until they are safely in the boats holds as many thrills as trout angling. But the life is not an easy one and as it has been no less than a dozen plying saws and swinging axes. It certainly will not cost some of them anything for fuel this summer or break of dawn until the sun sets at night. All day long back and forward they troll sometimes going for hours on end before getting a strike and then sometimes being disappointed by a shark taking their trophy just as they are about to land it. Rough weather is another thing that these hardy men have to contend with.

The two new boats that are being built at the slough in Cow Bay are slowly rounding into shape and the summer should see them slipping into the water.

The halibut boats, Joe Baker and Edward Lipsett, and the large trolling boat the Johanna are on the ways at Lipsett's getting a touch up with the paint brush and necessary repairs.

NEW BOAT CARRY FISH TO RUPERT

J. E. Berg of Ketchikan Looking For Craft For Run—Men Put to Work at First City

KETCHIKAN, March 18.—A crew of men was put to work under the direction of Carl Foss by J. E. Berg on the dock and warehouse which is to be constructed at the Berg mill for the Berg Packing Company salmon cannery plant. Arrangements already have been completed for putting up a salmon pack this summer.

The Berg Lumber & Shingle Company will be started in a couple of weeks' time, Mr. Berg announces. He announced there has been a lively demand lately for lumber and most of the old stock has been

cleaned out. There is half a million feet of logs on hand ready to go on. The shingle plant in the fall will be started at the same time.

Mr. Berg announced that the Marlyn Fish Company which he owns is negotiating for a boat to run between Ketchikan and Prince Rupert to handle fresh halibut and fresh salmon from Ketchikan to the eastern market. He stated that in the event of the deal being concluded that the boat would handle strictly the business only for the Marlyn Fish Company.
