STOCK MART IS STRONG

Sharp Rally in Late Trading Yesterday in New York, Toronto and Montreal

NEW YORK, Nov. 21: (CP)—Reports of better business and industrial conditions throughout the country with many companies declaring extra dividends caused securities to stage a sharp upward movement under heavy buying demand in late trading on the New York Stock Exchange yesterday. Gains of from one to four points being recorded. Motor shares were particularly strong and a number of issues reached new high levels for the year. The day's turnover amounted to 1,890,000 shares. The industrial average at closing was 101.28, up 2.61 from Saturday; rails, 39.45, up 1.16; utilities, 23.62, up .59, and bonds, 79.03, off .01.

Gains were also recorded in trading at Toronto and Montreal. Wheat was up 2c a bushel at Chicago and up 1c at Winnipeg.

PORTUGAL TO AZORES

Col. and Mrs. Charles A. Lindbergh Planned to Make 786-Mile Aerial Hop Today

LISBON, Portugal, Nov. 21:—Col. and Mrs. Charles A. Lindbergh, having spent the past week here following an aerial tour of Europe, were to hop off at 7 o'clock this morning for San Miguel Islands in the Azores, a distance of 786 miles, in commencement of their return trip home across the Atlantic Ocean.

They were not certain before leaving whether they would attempt to continue the flight home from the Azores or ship their plane and make the rest of the trip by steamer. This may depend upon weather conditions during the next few days.

Increase in Navy Enlisted Men and Marines is Asked

WASHINGTON, D.C., Nov. 21:—Authorization of an increase of 2500 in enlisted men of the United States Navy and of 1000 in the Marine Corps will be asked of Congress at its next session, it was announced yesterday.

PILLOWSLIP IS LOCATED

Further Confirmation of Murder of Kidnapped San Jose Youth

SAN JOSE, Cal., Nov. 21:—Further confirmation of the murder of Brooke Hart following his kidnapping on November 10 was afforded yesterday by the finding of a pillowslip in the water about a mile from San Mateo bridge where Thomas Thurmond and Jack Holmes have confessed that they threw the body of the youth into the bay after bludgeoning him into unconsciousness with a brick. In their confession, Thurmond and Holmes admitted placing a pillowslip over young Hart's head before they proceeded to kill him.

It has been intimated that Thurmond will plead insanity.

"There will be no repudiation or default until every effort has been made to prevent it through reduction of interest and overhead funding," Mr. Hart declared. "Twelve million dollars is required for interest and sinking funds." This could not be obtained from available revenue. There must be a refunding loan floated with the co-operation of the bankers and in the London market. He hoped to be able to tell the bondholders that they may continue to keep their bonds at a lower rate of interest or take cash and turn them in. He stated that the government would try to bring about a balanced budget.

Premier Pattullo said the province could not continue to pay exorbitant rates of interest. There would have to be refunding legislation. He declared that the national credit must be used to meet the unemployment situation.

Premier Pattullo and Mr. Hart were speaking at a Liberal campaign meeting in connection with the deferred election to be held next Monday for four seats in Victoria City, Mr. Hart being the head of the Liberal ticket.
