PROPOSED NEW MONEY

One of these has just been made public by the Distribution Control League of Vancouver which proposes the use of dated money, something like dated coffee, good only for a limited period.

The basis of the proposal is that money is simply a token representing undistributed goods. If all money issued were good only for, say one year from the date of issue, it would all be spent within that year and the goods which it repre- principles and their own experi- Third Street and Third Avenue, sented would be moved. There would be no hoarding.

Money, it is pointed out, is not a diety to be worshipped, nor is there anything mysterious or complicated about it. It is an accounting system which, by means of tokens and book entries, records the price and ownership of undistributed goods in the market and in its present form it is claimed that it is a very dishonest and dishonorable one. Instead of money being the servant, it is now the master.

It is said that a system such as proposed is in force at present in Bayaria and is working well. The notes issued would bear an inscription something like this:

"The Commodity Market of Canada will deliver to the bearer on or before September 30 goods to the value of big doses. one dollar." This money could not be hoarded. Each issue would be of a different color so that there would be no confusion. They might be similar to bread tickets only they would be backed by the credit of the state instead of the credit of the baker.
