Under the capable baton of H. N. Brocklesby, conductor, the Prince January 24. Rupert Philharmonic Society gave the second of this season's series of 12. concerts in the United Church before a large and appreciative aud- 21 ience last evening.

Consisting of a varied selection of carols, folk songs, anthems and negro spirituals ,the program was rendered with a precision of rhythm and a tone quality denoting talent and effort on the part of both conductor and members.

Features of the evening were a Phone 953 sympathetic rendition of Dale's "Before the Paling of the Stars," rich with eastern symbolism and nystery, in which C. H. 
