URGES NEED OF RESEARCH

Don Finn Gives Farewell Address at Meeting of Rotary Club Yesterday

D. B. Finn, director of the Prince Rupert Fisheries Experimental Station, who is being transferred to Halifax, gave his farewell message to the local Rotary Club, of which he was a member, at the luncheon yesterday.

Mr. Finn defended the spending of money by governments on research work, particularly emphasizing the desirability of doing so in order to compete when all other nations were doing the same. He said it was a well known fact that when the resources of the country were left to private interests they suffered. Intelligent governmental administration of natural resources was desirable.

There was little criticism of governments doing research work in connection with mining, forestry, agriculture or fisheries but, when it came to the more general work of aiding industry through research as was done by the National Research Council, there was apt to be a different viewpoint.

Mr. Finn drew attention to what was being done quietly in England in connection with research work. Much good work was being carried out there. He was amazed at the intense and thorough way in which they were rationalizing industry. The best minds of the nation were working on it. Much money was being spent and good results obtained. It was necessary in order to preserve the national integrity. Good financiers were useless without good industrialists.

Canada was a land of great resources with only ten million inhabitants. The country would prosper through the intelligent exploitation of these industries. In this research would be a great aid in rectifying the mistakes that had been made in getting together information for use in the future. They had a duty to perform to the producer, the consumer and the manufacturer.

In concluding his address Mr. Finn drew attention to the pleasant associations formed at the Rotary Club. Few places offered such a spontaneity of friendships as did the community of Prince Rupert.

TAKEN OVER BY PREMIER

Northern Mining Company Options Alexandria Mining Property Down the Coast

Alexandria mine at Phillips Arm, 120 miles up the coast from Vancouver, has been optioned by the Premier Gold Mining Co. and men are at present at work on the property getting it in shape for further development.

The Alexandria has been held for years by a group of British Columbians, principal of which is C. H. Dickie of Duncan. An eastern company worked it for a time four or five years ago under the superintendence of Thomas Davey and Graham Mines took a look at it a couple of years ago. During recent months Grant Mahood's Toronto companies were interested and secured an option but no work was done.

The success of the Enid-Jule mine is said to be the reason for Premier entering the Phillips Arm area. Enid-Jule is just above the Alexandria.
