about 10:45 Christmas Eve in the upsetting of a small boat in which he and a companion, Andy Simonen, were attempting to row a disance of less than a quarter of a aile between cabins at the island. A party of four men, Bernt Phinn and Hans Ludvheson in addition to Pioneer Customs Neilson and Simonsen, started out to row in one small boat and the other two men in the other. There was only about six inches of freeboard after Neitson and Simonsen got aboard and the tiny craft swamped about 150 feet from shore when a wind riffle came up, the two men being thrown into the water, Neilson, being a good swimmer, headed for shore but it was bitterly cold and Simonsen thought better of it and clung to the upturned boat and shouted for help. Phinn and Ludyheson turned back and pulled Simonsen to shore and came out again to look for Neilson Pound Sterling and whom they found floating straight up in the water with his head out. He had been drowned, however, and could not be revived despite efforts of an hour or so with artificial respiration.

New Regulations Out Catching of Salmon In Northern Waters

Designed to Help Operators of Smaller Types of Apparatus and Provide Employment For Many More Fishermen in Industry

WASHINGTON, D.C., Dec. 26: (CP)—New regulations for the Alaskan fisheries designed to help the operators of smaller types of fishing apparatus are announced today by the United States Bureau of Fisheries. Two important features are the reduction of the number of fish traps and the opening of previously closed fishing grounds to seine and other forms of gear. The changes are expected to provide employment for many more fishermen.
