Counter Revolution In Cuba Yesterday

Island to be Governed by Commission of Army, Navy and Police Officers Until Assembly Meets and **Selects Administration**

WASHINGTON, Sept. 5:-Warships of the United States navy were ordered to Cuba today to protect foreign lives and property. Meanwhile in Havana Cuba's revolutionary movement, less than a month old, was prepared to resign in favor of a commission of five men selected by leaders of soldiers, sailors and national police, who seized power through a bloodless coup-d-

'etat last night. Members of the new regime asserted they did not want to hold the positions permanently but would govern until a constitutional assembly selected their successors. They were not content with the progress of the revolution since the overthrow of Machado.
