### BOWSER PASSES

The sudden death of W. J. Bowser, former Premier of British Columbia, yesterday afternoon came as a sad blow to everyone. The movement which he had championed had failed and that, doubtless, had a good deal to do with hastening his end.


While Mr. Bowser was not a great man, he filled a useful purpose in the development of the province. At the time of the 1916 elections he had many bitter political enemies because he was a staunch party man and pinned his faith to the party machine. After his retirement people tried to remember his good points rather than those which had been criticized. Unhappily he was urged to make a belated effort to bring about better conditions in the province, an effort which he must have felt was destined to failure. People who met him recently and heard him read his speeches spoke of him as a broken old man but he did not give up.

Everyone must admire the courage and tenacity of the late Mr. Bowser. His demise must have met with general regret. Unhappily, he found it difficult to adjust himself to the requirements of modern conditions. He associated too much with men who live in the past rather than the future and who cannot understand the progress the world is making and the necessity of adjusting oneself to the change.

We shall join with people all over the province in expression of appreciation of a man of outstanding character. The fates were against his attaining a great position or doing great things.

replaced by a government resolution asking for absolute exclusion of Orientals and prohibition of Orientals from acquiring industrial rights within the province, and Mr. Bowser supported the measure.

### Return to Public Life

After considerable pressure had been brought to bear upon him, Mr. Bowser early this year returned to the political arena in British Columbia as leader of the new Independent Non-Partizan movement in opposition to the old line Conservative and Liberal parties as well as to the return to office of the Tolmie government with which it had been an open secret he (Mr. Bowser) had differed in opinion on many policies. It was known to Mr. Bowser's friends that his return to public life was against the advice of his physicians but he refused to admit that he was failing rapidly and went ahead with his plan. It was no surprise, however, when he relinquished the active leadership of the new faction some weeks ago, although accepting nomination as a candidate both in Vancouver and Victoria in the election contest.

Mr. Bowser was born in Rexton, N.B., Dec. 3, 1867, being of Scotch and English descent. He was the son of William and Margaret Bowser. His father was a merchant, and his paternal grandfather was John Bowser, who for many years was colonial magistrate in New Brunswick. Following graduation with a degree of B.A. from Dalhousie University, Halifax, in 1890, Mr. Bowser journeyed to Vancouver, where he formed a partnership and practised law under the firm name of Bowser and Lavelle. Later the firm became known as Bowser, Reid and Walbridge, which for years has been one of the best known legal firms in the province. He specialized in criminal law and on numerous occasions appeared as crown prosecutor. He was made a Q.C. in 1900.

On September 9, 1896, he married Miss Lorinda Doherty, of Vancouver, who died in 1928. Mrs. Bowser was an active worker in women's organizations in Vancouver and Victoria. There were no children.

Mr. Bowser spent the last few years in Victoria. He was a member of the Union Club, Victoria; of the Vancouver Club, and Mount Hermon Lodge, A.F. & A.M. He attained his thirty-second degree through Scottish Rite and in 1904 was elected grand master for British Columbia. He originally belonged to the Presbyterian Church and, after union, the United.
