STRIKE SETTLED IN ALBERTA

Cheering Report Comes from Nelson—Seven per Cent Increase of Wages but No Closed Shop.

(Canadian Press Despatch)
Nelson, June 30.—It is reported here on good authority that the settlement of the Alberta and Crow's Nest Pass coal strike has been arranged. The coal operators agree to offer the day workers an increase of seven per cent in wages and other concessions, but not including the closed shop. It is understood the strikers have agreed to accept the offer. An official announcement is to be made at the beginning of next week.
