WORKLESS MEETING

Saving of Homes From Tax Sale Chief Subject of Discussion

The meeting of the Unemployed Councils held last night in the Canadian Labor Defence League Hall was well attended.

The protest against low wages containing 1200 signatures was ordered to be sent to the Minister of Labor at Ottawa and Olof Hanson, M.P. for Skeena, notified.

The special business of the meeting was to discuss the predicament of many unemployed ratepayers who stand to lose their homes due to inability to pay taxes. After considerable discussion, it was decided to seek the co-operation of other labor organizations and a meeting of delegates will be called at an early date to consider how best to stop these threatened proceedings and present the views to a mass meeting of citizens.

The proposed road up Mount Oldfield was discussed and condemned as being of no utility value, it being merely a winter playground. It should, therefore, be built by those who can afford to use it or be paid for at standard rate of wages.

A vote of thanks was rendered to Frank Stevens of the Knox Hotel for his donation of a handsome twelve-volume encyclopedia for the use of the unemployed.

ISLANDS ARE BUSY

Moresby Island Particularly Active With Various Industries Operating

With three logging camps, one T. A. Kelley Logging Co. at All Inlet, the J. R. Morgan Logging Co. at Crescent Inlet and the A. P. Allison Co. at Queen Charlotte City, operating at full blast; the Consolidated Whaling Corporation's whaling station at Rose Harbor going strong after having been idle for two years and several gold mines in operation with many prospectors in the field on both the east and west coasts, Moresby Island of the Queen Charlotte group is having a busier season this summer than in several years past.

As far as the fishing industry on the Queen Charlotte Islands is concerned, there have been many trollers out both on the Hippo and North Island groups and, despite contrary reports, the fishermen who are willing to work are finding operations at least moderately profitable, the price for red springs ranging from 6 1/2c to 8c. The trolling fleet from Hippo have been moving to North Island where the fishing has been better. The fact that it is an off year for pinks and chums and that no salmon canneries will be in operation will make Masset Inlet quiet.

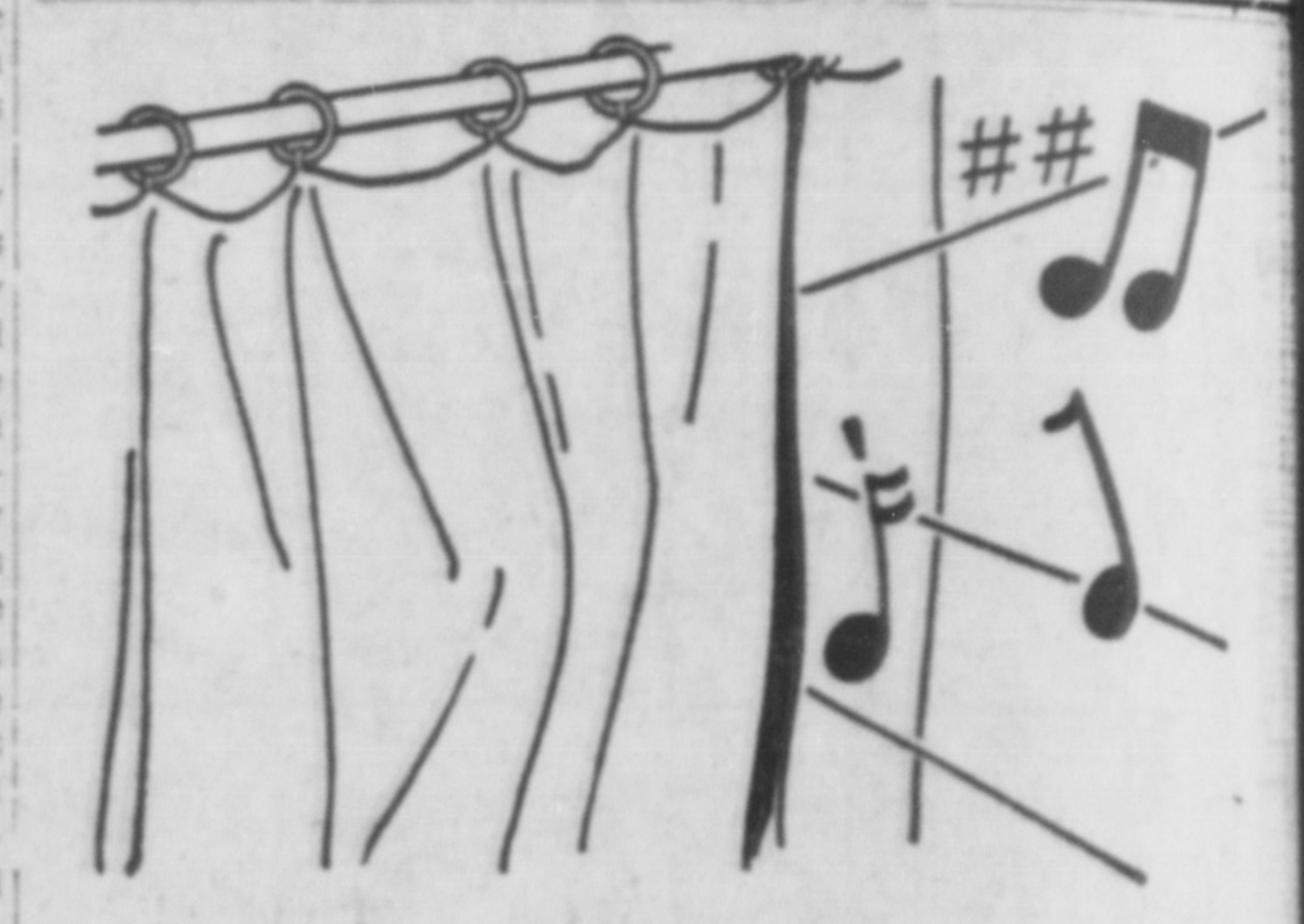
