Born in Dorsetshire, Eng., the late Mr. Jeans had been a resident of Canada for some years and came to this district from Edmonton. In addition to a widow, he is survived by a daughter, Mrs. Gunnar Clavring of this city. He was a member of the Moose Lodge under the auspices of which the funeral will be held with Haynor Bros. in charge of arrangements.
