Dominion Wheat Stock This Spring Over Three Hundred Million Bush.

Increase of 66,668,671 Bushels is, However, Much Less Than Crop Production of 1932 Compared With Year Previous

OTTAWA, April 13: (CP)-Stocks of wheat in Canada on March 31 are estimated by the Dominion Bureau o Statistics at 312,819,244 bushels as compared with 246,-150,573 bushels at the end of March, 1932, an increase of 66,668,671. The increase over the 1932 figures is, however, much less than the increase in crop production of 1932 as compared with that of 1931.

Alaska Legislature Moves to Exclude Outsiders From Industry-Bill

Before Governor

JUNEAU, April 13: (CP)-Taxes on non-resident fishermen in Alaska would be more than doubled by the Taylor Bill which is now before Governor John M. Troy after passing both branches of the territorial legislature.

A fee is set up for non-resident seiners, gill-netters and trollers of \$25. In addition, licences would be limited to American citizens and aliens who declared their intention of becoming citizens.
