

Plea For Success of Gathering Made by Monarch and Echoed by British Premier-Canada Elected to Important Conference Bureau

LONDON, June 12: (Canadian Press)—Reading like a "Who's Who" of the universe, representatives of sixty-six nations including one president, eleven prime ministers, more than twenty foreign ministers and another score of finance ministers controlling the destinies of nearly two billion people today listened to King George formally open the world disarmament conference at the Museum of Geology here.

"In the face of a crisis which we Commissioner at all realize and acknowledge," said the King, "I appeal to you all to cooperate for the sake of the ultimate good of the world."

"We must not fail," echoed Prime Minister J. Ramsay MacDonald a few minutes later. "Men who succeed must face their work in the spirit of conquerors. We give to the world as a note of the first meeting that we are determined to succeed nor can we delay. Rapidity of agree-
