Pound Sterling Skyrockets and Silver Price Has Most Spectacular Advance in History of Trading in New York-Stock Market Leaps Forward

WASHINGTON, D.C., April 19: (CP) - President Franklin D. Roosevelt today announced the immediate restoration of the gold embargo as a move to improve domestic commodity prices. This is the first step in a campaign the President has undertaken to establish a control-VICTORIA, April 19: (CP)- led price level and controlled credit to counteract defla-

The President hopes to get the world back on the gold tandard but this standard may be on a different gold ratio than in the past.

Giving up of further attempt to support the American dollar in foreign exchange is regarded as serving the dual purpose of increasing American commodity prices and putting the President in a strategic position for economic pargainings.
