VALUE OF EDUCATION

Rev. W. D. Grant Hollingworth Speaks to Rotary Club Showing Disproportion in Relative Importance

"It would seem as if debts are apparently the only fixed element among the fluctuating factors which make up the world of business. Employment may decline, sales may fall off, wages and salaries may be reduced. All incomes from which interest and principal payments must be met may dwindle. The value of assets may shrink but debts remain stabilized. The owner of the bond knows to a cent what he is entitled to receive and he has a legal right and he is supposed to have a moral right to wreck the concern or break the debtor in his effort to get it." This was one of the interesting paragraphs of an intensely interesting and forceful address delivered yesterday afternoon at the luncheon of the Rotary Club in the Commodore Cafe by Rev. W. D. Grant Hollingworth, pastor of First Presbyterian Church. Another interesting paragraph was:

It is not the fact of debt but the grave disproportion between debt and income that constitutes an impediment to recovery. Why is it? people are asking, and they have a right to ask, "that bond interests are counted as sacred when wage agreements and conditions governing employment are not so counted? Why is it that wage agreements and conditions governing employment are considered to be the chief field for economy and are singled out to bear the brunt in the reforms suggested by those in charge?"

Mr. Hollingworth spoke of the loss to the community by making boys live a life of idleness at a time when there was no employment for them and they could not get into the high school. "Human values," he said, "should be considered alongside monetary values. The child's right to an education adequately fitting him for his future responsibilities and opportunities should be considered alongside the taxpayers' right to relief from financial burdens."

John Dybhavn, president of the Rotary Club, was in the chair.

Miss Gracie Fields, Noted Variety Entertainer, Star of "Looking on the Bright Side"


