All Gold in Country Being Called in Except That Used For Certain Specific Purposes-Order Issued Last Night by Department of Treasury

WASHINGTON, D.C., Dec. 29: (CP)-An intensive campaign for the remonetization of silver in the United States was assured today when twenty-seven senators went on record in favor of free and unlimited coinage by the government of both gold and silver. This is a further development of the program being advocated by Senator

Wheeler whereby silver would be rehabilitated on a ratio of approxi-

mately sixteen to one with gold. Another important development in connection with hie metal situation in the country took place with the issuance last night by the Treasury Department of an order for payment into the United States Treasury of all gold coins, bullion and certificates, virtually the only exception to the order being gold held by the federal reserve banks und reconstruction finance corporation together with some minor exceptions including gold being used for manufacturing purposes, professionally, etc.
