

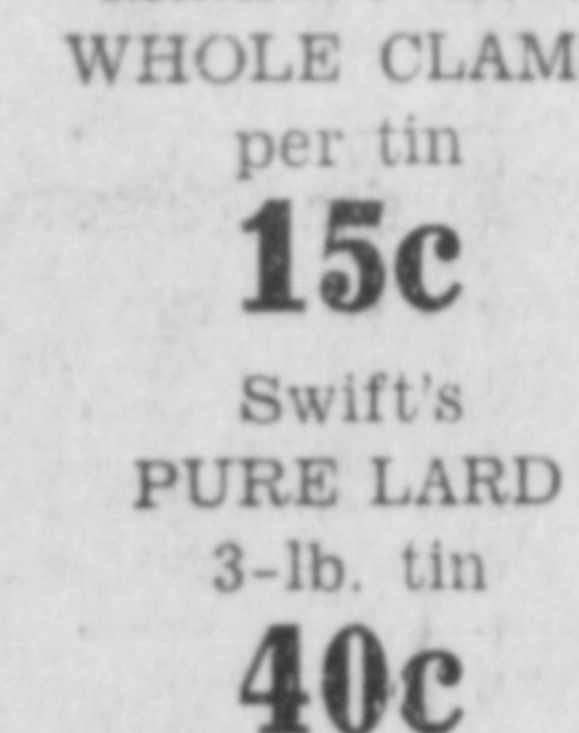

Honor Memory Of Scots' Poet

(Continued from Page 1)
Responding to the toast of 'The Immortal Memory,' Mr. Blackstock remarked that in every land on that evening there were gatherings of Scotsmen, and others not so favored, to honor the memory of Robert Burns.

The speaker asked the people to remember the times in which Burns lived. Most of the people were Jacobites. The poet to most people was a revolutionist. Had he lived today he would have been a communist. He lived chiefly among poor people and wrote about them. As to the drinking of which he is accused, it was a general custom of the country at that time. Eventually Burns joined a company of volunteers and when he died was buried with military honors.

Other Addresses
Thomas McClymont spoke humorously and well for Bonnie Scotland in reply to the toast. He mentioned the many jokes at their expense which they all enjoyed. Incidentally he thanked the ladies for the fine entertainment they had provided.

Rev. W. D. Grant Hollingworth gave an eloquent address on Canada and W. W. C. O'Neill praised the bonnie lassies of Scotland, the lassies of whom Burns was fond. The evening closed with the singing of Auld Lang Syne.
