### Transatlantic Service

When the Pan American company has established a scheduled service to Newfoundland, the Imperial Airways will immediately complete plans for service across the North Atlantic to Newfoundland, thus opening the first transatlantic service between Europe and the North American continent.

The Imperial Airways will use a fleet of planes on the route, via Iceland, Greenland and Labrador.

Latest reports received here indicate that both companies are confident the connection can be made in 1934. Several successful flights have been made over the northern route and the Capt. Wolfgang Von Gronau's repetition of the journey has won strong support for the promoters.

"Mask of Dr. Fu Manchu" and "He Learned About Women" Showing at Capitol Theatre


