Running under the handicap of having to change their sprinters following the motor accident which occurred on the long drive to New York, the Canadian girls showed plenty of courage in securing second place to the Newark team out of a field of fourteen starters. The Newark girls were forced to break the world's record to offset the challenge of the battered girls from Canada, who ran despite their injuries and still managed to make a splendid showing. Left to right: Mildren Frizell, who was disqualified by Starter McHugh in the quarter finals of the sprint for false breaking; Dot Brookshaw, whose spine was injured when she was tossed out of the motor car; Gladys Moffitt, another member of the team who was in the car which argued with a tree (she was also thrown clear of the car and competed with badly injured legs); Myrtle Brown, the young runner put in at the last moment and who ran a splendid anchor position for the team.
