WORK AND WAGES

The labor candidates for the Edmonton city council have adopted as their platform the elimination of the dole and the substitution thereof of a system of giving work at reasonable wages. This is being backed up by the Edmonton Bulletin which urges strongly that the federal government be urged to loan money to the province without interest as was done in the case of the C. P. R. This, it is urged, is the only practical method of dealing with the "growing evil of unemployment." It is also the policy being urged by T. D. Pattullo, the leader of the Liberals in British Columbia and Liberal candidate for Prince Rupert.

WILL WEATHER THE STORM

E. W. Beatty K.C., head of the C. P. R. system, declares emphatically that Canada will weather the storm and he also declares that everyone in the east has unbounded faith in Canada. The outlook has generally shown improvement in the last six months, the C. P. R. president states, and, while not wishing to appear unduly optimistic, he thinks the worst is over. That is pretty good for a careful official, especially at a time when he is asking for a cut in wages on the railway.

CONSERVATIVES NOMINATE

It is announced that Conservatives have nominated candidates in Victoria. They are unionists of the Premier Tolmie stripe, it is understood. Another Conservative association nominated Col. W. W. Foster for the Islands as an independent. It should now be in order, if they wished, for a Liberal convention to nominate a man to run on the Tolmie ticket or possibly as a C. C. F. These truly are curious times.

FINE NEW MAP

Owing to the increased interest being taken in mining in Northern British Columbia, the department of lands of British Columbia has just issued a new map covering that part of the province from the mouth of the Naas River to the northern boundary. It gives a mass of detail not formerly included in the maps of the province and should prove very useful to miners and others who are interested. It gives the detailed survey of the boundary between British Columbia and Alaska and also hints as to the mineralization and the navigability of streams.

KETCHIKAN EXCURSION

Two Hundred Local Persons Expected to Make Trip at End of Week Over Holiday

Announcement was made this morning by Canadian National Steamships that sufficient bookings had been made to guarantee that the steamer Prince Rupert will make its contemplated excursion trip from here to Ketchikan this week-end over the Thanksgiving holiday. The vessel will leave Saturday night at 10 o'clock, arrive at Ketchikan 8 o'clock Sunday morning, sail from Ketchikan at 1 o'clock Monday morning and return here at 8:30 a.m. Monday.

It is expected that some 200 persons will make the trip, those booked up to this morning totalling 170. Space on the vessel is already at a premium.

The Chamber of Commerce at Ketchikan has appointed a special committee to look after entertainment of the local visitors and, among other things, there will be a dance there on Sunday night. There is also to be a special entertainment on board the steamer, a local dance orchestra having been engaged.

PHONED TO VANCOUVER

Bert Tupper of the Northwest Telephone Co. who has been at Anxox and Stewart in connection with the extension of his company's commercial radiotelephone service on this coast, arrived in the city on the Catala this morning from the north and will be in town for a few days.

The first telephone call from Vancouver to Stewart was made last Friday when the superintendent of the Government Telegraph Service called up Stanley Benton, Stewart relieving operator. Results were quite satisfactory, each party hearing the other plainly.

The Vancouver man put in the call from his own office, using the regular Vancouver city telephone. Connection was made with the Vancouver wireless telephone exchange and the conversation transmitted over the ether to Anxox, whence connection was made to Stewart over the Government Telegraph lines.

This call was in the nature of an experiment, the service not yet being available to the public though it is hoped that it soon will be.

DEATH OF STRIBLING

Noted Boxer Succumbs to Injuries Sustained in Auto Crash

MACON, Ga., Oct. 3 (CP)—Despite reports issued yesterday that the former famous heavyweight boxer was showing marked improvement and was believed to have a good chance for recovery, W. L. (Young) Stribling died this morning from injuries suffered in a motorcycle accident on Sunday.

Stribling had stopped his motorcycle on the road to chat with friends and the vehicle was struck by a speeding automobile, the former boxer sustaining a crushed leg and pelvis and fractured hip, it being necessary to amputate the left leg. He suffered severely from shock which is believed to have caused his death. He passed away in the same hospital in which his wife was a patient, having given birth to a child a few days ago.

Stribling had a long and successful ring career which culminated two or three years ago in an unsuccessful attempt to lift the world's heavyweight crown. He had not been very active in the ring since then.

TO STAY RETIRED

President Hoover Has No Intention Of Becoming President of Stanford University

PALO ALTO, Cal., Oct. 3.—It was announced yesterday by the secretary of the former president of the United States that Herbert Clark Hoover had retired and intended to remain retired. The former chief executive contemplated making his permanent future home here.

The statement was issued in denying reports which have been current that Mr. Hoover might succeed Dr. Ray Lyman Wilbur as president of Stanford University.

MAY DIE IN CHAIR

George Kelly and Albert Bates to Take Trial For Lives Following Arraignment

OKLAHOMA CITY, Oct. 3.—Under the laws of the State of Oklahoma, death in the electric chair looms for George (Machine Gun) Kelly and Albert Bates on charges of robbery with use of firearms for which they were arraigned yesterday, trial being set for Thursday. Under the laws of this state armed robbery is punishable by death.

The charges against Kelly and Bates arise out of the recent kidnaping of Charles Urschel, Oklahoma millionaire.
