WAY OF ENGLISH WOMEN

Their Natural Shyness Puzzles the Women of Other Lands

The aloofness of the English women is not due to dull disdain of their fellow creatures, but to a native shyness, which makes it painfully difficult to expand in the presence of strangers.

A German lady came from Berlin to London with a number of introductions. Some time afterwards one asked her how she fared. It appeared that her impressions were mixed. She pronounced the English an incomprehensible people. At first she thought them the most brutal race on earth.

ITEMS OF SPORT

Mike Donlin, who is back with the Giants, is being used as a pinch hitter. Mike expects to be in the regular line-up before long.

The Pittsburg club paid \$2,500 for shortstop Sovelin, who comes from the Erie Q. and P. league team.

Baseball fans in several New England league cities have been handling the umpires pretty roughly this season.

President Lindsay has suspended Eddie Householder of the Victoria team, indefinitely on a charge laid by Umpire Steve Kane.

President Comiskey of the Chicago Americans has purchased Pitcher "Flam" Delhi, of the Los Angeles Club. Delhi is reported to be the pitching sensation of his league.

Stephen W. White, the Princeton College pitcher, has signed a contract to pitch for the Boston Americans and will report to the team at once, according to President Taylor of the Boston team White's home is Boston.

Several business men of Cincinnati have subscribed \$50 and will wire the money to Umpire William Klem of the National League in St. Louis. This money is to pay his fine for striking Manager Bresnahan of the St. Louis Nationals in Cincinnati.

The interesting announcement is made that Lord Desborough, who is his day was one of the best all-round athletes in England, will visit Canada shortly and will travel across the continent to Vancouver. In his college days when he was plain W. H. Grenfell, he made some good records at swimming, fencing and punting. Writing to a friend in the west Lord Desborough says: "I am glad to see that Life Saving is making such progress in Canada." He also adds that he will be in the west in the autumn.

It would be difficult to say what Lord Desborough has not done. He has rowed from Oxford to London in a day, stroked an eight across the English Channel, won punting and fencing championships, thrice climbed the Matterhorn, shot in the Rockies, twice swam Niagara, caught 100 tarpon fish in three weeks in India, and helped to make the Olympic Games in London three years ago the success that they were. He was president of the British Olympic council, and represents Britain on the International Olympic Committee.

A boxing contest, which in reality was an unadulterated exhibition of slugging between Street-er of Cranbrook and Dragon of Fernie, was brought to a finish in the ninth round the other night at Fernie by the counting out of Dragon. From the Opera House Dragon was conveyed to the hospital in a state of unconsciousness, where it was found upon examination he had received injuries affecting the brain, evidently a clot of blood causing pressure thereon. His pulse was far below normal and his condition considered extremely critical. Later he regained consciousness and more encouraging hopes are entertained of his recovery than at first.
