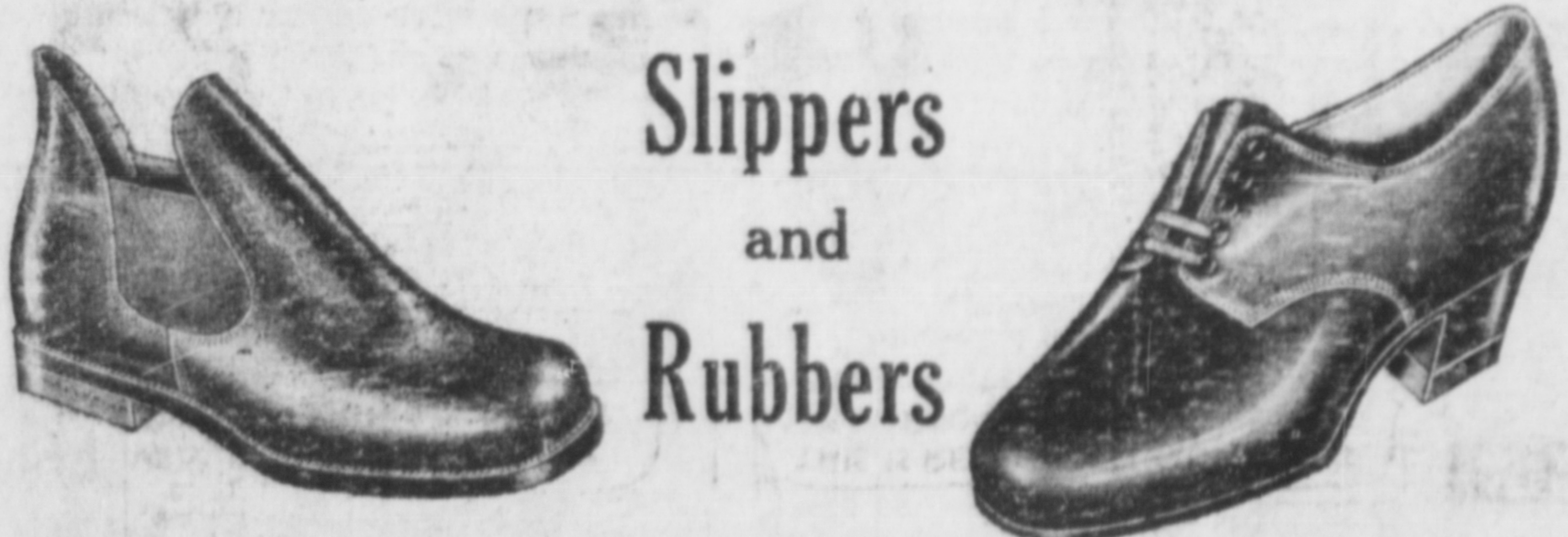

### MINING ENGINEER SEES PROBABLE INCREASE IN DISTRICT

had been in spite of the increased production. Depreciation in currency had had a marked effect on the production of gold, such as was

evident in Australia. It was produced in terms of the depreciated pound of that country and sold in terms of pound sterling.

The New Guinea operations, in which Mr. Batten said he was interested, were carried out by means of airplanes. There were no roads to the mine. Three dredges were now at work there, and all the ma-

chinery and supplies had been taken in by planes. As a result of the depreciated currency the ore was mined for six cents a yard instead of a normal 15c.

The activity in the neighborhood of Nelson was mentioned and also the Bridge River and Cariboo. What made the Bridge River field particularly valuable was the fact that very little erosion had taken place there. The result was that, while prospecting was difficult, the bodies of ore widened as they went down. The Bridge River mines should be more important 25 years from now than they are today. In most parts of the province there had been so much erosion that only the roots of the ore bodies remained.
