palities going into the hands of receivers, with the financial resources of our people being depleted and, worse than that, with their morals being broken down, is there nothing tangible to offer? Is it sufficient to sit back and say that the Legislature can do nothing?

"If the collective power of our people, as represented through government, is unable to move forward but only to drift backward, what can be expected of private endeavor?"

"Right upon our provincial highways we have seven thousand men in camps, and road material for our roads, and roads that badly need improving but we cannot bring the roads, the road material and the men, together."

"The present state of affairs cannot be permitted to continue. The physical and mental powers of our people must be mobilized and our credit used to start the wheels of industry moving."

Suggestions

As a temporary measure, Mr. Pattullo said, useful public works should be started and carried out on the basis of the payment of a reasonable wage. This, of itself, would increase purchasing power and would result in a diminishing number of unemployed.

As many people as possible should be placed upon the land. The man who was able to grow his own food supplies was in a very much better position than standing in the bread-line, or being herded into camps.

He noted the Minister of Lands was announcing some new land policy. If it were a feasible policy, the speaker would be glad to support it when submitted to this House, but long since should adequate measures have been taken.

Consideration would have to be given to the spread of endeavor through shorter working hours and shorter week. Already large industry has begun the process in the United States and, he believed, at least one large concern in the Dominion of Canada. This should be accomplished without the reduction of wages below a reasonable standard of living.

Economic Council

He believed that a national economic council should be established as well as provincial economic councils to collaborate therewith. These councils should be composed of scientists, industrialists, economists and labor. Through the efforts of the organization, industrial effort could be co-ordinated and a closer relationship between production and consumption could be brought about. This organization could be of immense benefit in assisting private enterprise in the securing and holding of markets and the wheels of progress be set moving.

"Consideration also should be given to the refunding of our obligations at lower rate of interest," Mr. Pattullo proceeded. "The people of today have become fearful of what the future has in store. Many are not spending what

they otherwise would spend, not knowing just what is going to happen.

"I have been assured by many holders of bonds that they would gladly accept a lesser rate of interest if they could be assured of their principal."

"At a time when commodity prices are extremely low and wages are extremely low, the price of money is extremely high and this province itself is paying ruinous interest rates."

"It is not the policy of the party which I lead to say that we must sit down and do nothing and that nothing can be done. There is a great deal that can and must be done. All that it requires is courage and common sense to do it, but it is clear from the record of this government that it is impossible to expect results from it."

Sol Mussallem To Be Liberal Vs. Lougheed

Former Prince Rupert Man Likely To Contest Dewdney Against Minister of Lands

The Victoria Times of recent date has the following: Reeve Solomon Mussallem, of Maple Ridge, dynamic personality in municipal politics in the Fraser Valley, is slated to run on the Liberal ticket for the riding of Dewdney at the forthcoming provincial election.

If he is nominated as a candidate to represent the Liberal party in Dewdney, Mr. Mussallem will oppose Hon. N. S. Lougheed, Minister of Lands.

The "Mussolini of Maple Ridge," as he has been popularly dubbed, is in Victoria today with a representative delegation of reeves from the lower British Columbia mainland to attend the convention of the Union of B.C. Municipalities. here on Wednesday.

When seen at the Empress Hotel this morning, Mr. Mussallem admitted that he had been urged to contest the Dewdney seat and he did not deny that he would run for provincial office when the election guns start booming.

He has a strong following throughout the Fraser Valley district and his chances of carrying the seat are considered exceptionally good.

He is now serving his fourth term as Reeve of Maple Ridge.

In discussing the political situation, Mr. Mussallem said there was no doubt that the Tolmie administration was through and in a straight fight would easily be defeated by the Liberal party. He further believes that the split in the Conservative ranks and formation of the new Bowser party will help the Pattullo forces when it comes to an expression of the franchise by the people.

Mr. Mussallem was associated with Mr. Pattullo in Prince Rupert and he considers him one of the most upright and forceful men in politics today.

Will Speed Up Court Business In Old Country

LONDON, March 6.—Greater expedition in the dispatch of court business or greater economy in the administration of justice in the Supreme Court is regarded as desirable and a committee has been appointed by the Lord Chancellor, Lord Sankey, with a view to considering the matter in the interests of speeding up. The chairman of the committee is Lord Hanworth, Master of the Rolls.

The committee is also instructed to consider whether these reforms

could be attained by any alteration in the days of sittings and the vacations of the Supreme Court, and by the elimination of restriction of the rights of appeal to within or from that court.
