Spencer Seaplane Hops Off For Prince George Enroute to Mc-Connell Creek

After refuelling, Col. Victor Spencer's Junkers seaplane "City of Prince George," piloted by W. R. McCluskey, which arrived at 12.30 noon yesterday from Juneau following a ten-day prospecting expedition into the Rainy Hollow and Pelly River sections with W. S. Harris, Col. Spencer's chief field man, on board, hopped off at 4 o'clock yesterday afternoon for Prince George whence it will make a flight into McConnell Creek and elsewhere in the Omineca mining division. The plane is due back here about the middle of next week on its way to Vancouver.

In addition to Mr. Harris, the plane brought down from the north yesterday Horace McN. Frasince last April carrying out surveys of mineral property for Col. Spencer. On the same property some diamond drilling is being carried out with favorable results. Together with D. J. McRae, Vancouver prospector, in whose ground Col.
