### WHIFFLETS From the Waterfront

Reporting that wind and generally unfavorable weather conditions had permitted of little progress being made on the job of salvaging the local halibut boat Livingstone II which stranded and sank over two weeks ago on the west coast of Dundas Island, Capt. W. P. Armour came in this morning from the scene of the wreck aboard the O. N. The Jodway and salvage equipment are remaining at the scene to which Capt. Armour may return within a day or so. The Livingstone is resting at thirty fathoms of pinnacle rock. Breakers rolling as high as 20 to 30 feet have damaged much salvage gear. It is possible salvage may prove impracticable.

The Armour Salvage Co.'s local service boat Salvage Princess, Capt. Reg. Green, which went to Vancouver recently with the Moth seaplane of the Northern B. C. Airways in tow, is due back about Friday with a scowload of lumber for Albert & McCaffery. The Salvage Princess, which left Vancouver for here last Wednesday, was reported yesterday to be crossing Queen Charlotte Sound.

### CONDITIONS AT ANYOX

Immediate Investigation Will be Asked by Delegation to Victoria

Armed with sworn statements of former employees in the working, a delegation sponsored by the local unemployed and consisting of Harvey Murphy, national organizer of the Mine Workers' Union of Canada, Russell Barr and Joe Sarich sailed yesterday afternoon on the Cardena for Victoria where they will demand of the Legislature, before the present session prorogues, that a public investigation be immediately made into allegedly dangerous condition of the Hidden Creek and Bonanza mines at Anyox "in order that a repetition of the Blakeburn disaster may not occur and in order to protect the lives of the workers there." The proposed investigation committee, it is demanded, should be composed of representatives of various trades unions and labor bodies, workers who have been employed at Anyox and representatives of the government and company. It is claimed that each succeeding month conditions at these mines become more dangerous due to the shooting out of huge sections of pillars with battery rounds of powder, the concussion from the large explosions displacing and cracking the whole structure of the mine not only in the vicinity of the shots but for hundreds of feet around and entailed great danger to powdermen and other workers who are employed there.

Among those making sworn statements in regard to conditions at Anyox are Russell Barr, Dan Bahich, Lars Larson, Joseph Sarich, John Sakulich and Mike Marchuk.
