

Livingstone Salvaged

Despite the heavy lashing of the eas and the difficult position of he sunken vessel, the Armour Salage Co. under the personal direcion of Capt. Paul Armour, manged to salvage the local halibut oat Livingstone II early this week rom the depths of the ocean off he west coast of Dundas Island where she sank over three weeks previous. This job was one of the most difficult ones that had been ried by the local company. Weeks of patient waiting at last was rewarded when the boat was successfully tackled, raised and lashed to the wrecking scow. The boat was not, however, brought entirely out of water but was secured underneath the scow and, therefore, it was necessary to wait for a high tide before bringing her through Metlakatla Pasage. 
