PORT SIMPSON'S CENTENARY

Next year the village of Port Simpson celebrates its hundredth birthday. The post established there by the st. Louis Hudson Bay Company in 1834 was one of the first in Bri- Pittsburg tish Columbia. Possibly Fort St. James may have preceded it although that is not sure.

When Lieutenant-Governor Fordham Johnson was there last year he promised that, if invited for the centenary celebration, he would come. High officials of the Hudson Bay Company are also likely to be invited. There is no good reason why it should not be the greatest festival that Port Simpson has ever had.

The townsite of Port Simpson is a delightful one. Many thought it would have been chosen as the terminus of the Grand Trunk Pacific Railway and some still think would have been the better choice. Happily, however, it was Boston unspoiled in that way and remains a picturesque village with a weekly mail service, a delightful cimate, sandy beaches, and people of taste and discrimination. The people of Port Simpson have the ability to stage one of the biggest events ever held in the north and, doubtless, next year will see them actively engaged on the project.
