

## ROSE HARBOR'S \$70,000 FIND OF AMBERGOIS

Mass Waighing 240 Pounds Got in Carcase of a Sperm Whale Just Landed—Sells in Europe at \$20 an Ounce—A Rich Haul

A mass of ambergris weighing about 240 lbs. and valued at approximately \$70,000 has been obtained from the carcase of a sperm whale brought ashore at the beginning of this week at Rose Harbor Whaling Station on Moresby Island, the southernmost of the Queen Charlotte group. This is an example of one of the biggest possible plums of the whaling venture on these coasts, and well repays the whalers for their really arduous toil. Ambergris sells in Europe at nearly \$20 an ounce.

Explaining the nature of the find and the reason for its great value, the Manager from the Rose Harbor Whaling station remarks that it is only from the sperm whale that the stuff is ever obtained. Ambergris is a morbid secretion of the nature of an abscess, which clots and hardens in the intestines of the whale. It is believed that the formation is caused by the presence in the whale's stomach of parts of the bodies of cuttle fish which the whale devours. Sperm whales are fond of cuttle fish that the average boy's best girl is of candy, and cuttle fish, like candy, doesn't always agree with "The Hotel Jonah" of Sir Sperm Whale.

The ambergris is occasionally treated like the prophet by the whale, and is thus sometimes found floating on the sea, or cast on shore. The reason for its

## A. BROWN TRIED AGAIN TO GET BOTTLE LICENSE

License Commissioners After a Brief Deliberation Refused to Consider the Matter—Said Application Was Out of Order in Many Ways

At the meeting of the Licence Board yesterday before any other business was done W. E. Fisher who has been acting for Mr. Austin Brown the disappointed applicant for a bottle licence, asked whether the application had been refused by the Commissioners only on the ground that Mr. Brown had not produced the statutory declaration to the effect that he had complied with the requirements of the Act in reference to the signatures of property owners, etc.

He said if it were merely on this ground that the application had been turned down it might be re-considered still as there is nothing in the statute to preclude a verbal declaration being given to the effect required, and this Mr. Brown was prepared to give.

After some little discussion, the Commissioners decided not to consider this application as suggested by Mr. Fisher as the City Solicitor maintained that Mr. Brown's application papers were not in order in other aspects besides the one mentioned by Mr. Fisher.

## PROVINCE HAD A GOOD YEAR

Hon. Dr. Young, Points Out to Victoria Board of Trade Some Evidences of Prosperity.

(Canadian Press Despatch)

Victoria, July 15.—In a review of the progress of British Columbia, in practically every line of material endeavor Hon. Dr. Young, Provincial Secretary, in speaking before the annual meeting of the Board of Trade today, pointed out that while the foreshadowed revenue for the fiscal year ending 1910 had been placed at \$7,000,026.66, the actual revenue reached had been \$10,481,415.61. This was three and a half millions in excess of the government anticipations, and meant a surplus over expenditures instead of a deficit as had been expected.
