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NOVEL TYPE OF PICTURE

"Crime of the Century" Confessed to Before Committed—Police Baffled

Jean Hersholt, Stuart Erwin, Wynne Gibson and Frances Dee head the cast of "The Crime of the Century," mystery drama in a new style, which comes to the Capitol Theatre here this week-end. Gordon Westcott and David Landau have the principal supporting roles.

"The Crime of the Century" offers two innovations in presentation of a mystery story. First, the crime is confessed to police before it is committed, and yet is carried through while they watch. Second, halfway through, there is a 60-second intermission, during which the various clues to the solution are reviewed briefly, and the audience is invited to attempt to solve it.

The picture centres around Hersholt, an alienist, who walks into a police station, tells the assembled officers that he has planned a murder, describes how it will be carried through, and begs to be locked up so that he will be unable to commit it. Impressed by his manner as well as his reputation, officers accompany him to his home.
