BETTER POSITION

The Tolmie government has strengthened its position very materially during the past few days. The fact that one or two ministers who had shown independent tendencies have decided to stay with the old party indicates that they have sensed the political outlook and believe there is a chance of being returned in the fall. The slight improvement in conditions will tend to favor them.

Conservatives say that the appointment of a minister of labor from the All-Canadian labor group will divide the labor forces which are usually against the Conservatives and the Socialists who are entering the field will do the rest.

According to the same authority there will be as many Liberals support the new Unionist party as will support the Bowserites. In most places, too, the Conservatives control the old Conservative organizations. In view of this, it is claimed, the Tolmie reorganized government has a good fighting chance.

In Prince Rupert the majority of the old Conservatives seem to be favoring the Bowser party but it is not the same in all communities. The whole political condition is very complicated.

FREE GOLD PROPERTY

This paper has published several articles in regard to the Haida Gold Mines Ltd. which has a free milling ore, carrying good values with many thousands of tons of ore in sight. This property, which is situated on the west coast of Moresby Island, is of such a nature that, immediately operations commence, it will be able to ship sufficient gold to pay the cost of operating. In that it differs from most mining properties on the coast.

In view of the reports, official and otherwise, in regard to the Queen Charlotte Islands, it seems as if there is a better field for prospectors there than in most parts of the north. The difficulty is that prospecting may prove expensive there unless a tie-up could be arranged with fishing boats going to the west coast to transport supplies.

PITTSBURG LEAD CUT

Pirates Drop Game to Dodgers—Yanks Win in American

PITTSBURG, May 23 (Canadian Press)—Pittsburgh Pirates, as a result of a shut out defeat at the hands of Brooklyn Dodgers here yesterday, had their margin of leadership in the National League reduced to 1½ games over the New York Giants who shut out the Cincinnati Reds at Cincinnati. The Dodgers, by virtue of their win, advanced from fifth to fourth place ahead of the Reds.

In the American League, the New York Yankees shut out the Cleveland Indians at Yankee Stadium and maintained their one game margin of supremacy over the Washington Senators who were eking out a close victory over the Detroit Tigers at the National capital. The Boston Red Sox had a one-run margin victory over the Chicago White Sox at Boston and climbed into a tie for seventh place with the Detroit Tigers. Yesterday's Big League scores:


