CABINET REORGANIZATION

Premier Tolmie's cabinet re-organization, so far at least, has proven far less extensive than might have been expected from the earlier expressed intentions of the 336 Second Avenue, Prime Minister on the subject. The actual net changes are | Phone Blue 320 the dropping of Hon. W. C. Shelly, Hon. N. S. Lougheed and Hon. William Atkinson from the cabinet, the addition of Hon. W. H. Dennies as the new minister of labor and the taking over of the portfolios of agriculture and lands by Dr. Tolmie and Hon. Joshua Hinchliffe respectively. Hon. James W. Jones, Hon. Rolf W. Bruhn, Hon. R. H. Pooley, Hon. S. L. Howe and Hon. R. L. Maitland remain in the government and, apparently, may be expected to continue as supporters of Prime Minister Tolmie. The much-heralded new "union" cabinet material is conspicuous by its absence unless Mr. Dennies, the virtually unknown head of a Vancouver Labor faction, might be considered under that category.

It is quite evident that Premier Tolmie has been unable to do better than weakly patch up his fast sinking ship of state with such of the old material still remaining in his grasp. To all observers and most of the Premier's former supporters it is as equally obvious that the Tolmie political ship will founder a complete wreck on the reefs of the forthcoming provincial election.

With an ignominous defeat for the Tolmie government a foregone conclusion and political observers conceding that the best the Bowser "non-partizan" party can expect is a little support from the capitalistic community of Vancouver which conceived and is sponsoring it, the odds as far as the election result is concerned appear to be daily becoming even stronger and stronger in favor of the return to office of T. D. Pattullo and a government with constructive and practical policies to meet the present difficult situation. As stated before, it is only a question of how soon the election will be held until Prince Rupert's member, with his party solidly behind him, becomes the Premier of British Columbia.
