### Oat Meal Cookies

One cup of sugar, half cup lard or butter, half cup of sweet milk, one third teaspoonful of cream of tartar, two cupfuls of flour, three cupfuls of oat meal. Season to suit taste. Put oat meal through meat grinder and add an egg.

### Chicken and Corn Soup

Take two quarts of the liquor in which a chicken has been boiled, add one pint of corn scraped from the cob, chopped, one tablespoonful of finely chopped onion and one scant teaspoonful of salt and simmer, closely covered, for an hour. Rub through a fine sieve and return to the fire. In a small saucepan melt one tablespoonful of butter, add two tablespoonfuls of flour and when mixed, one cupful of rich milk or cream. Add gradually a portion of the soup and when smooth turn into the large kettle. Season to taste, sprinkle in one tablespoonful of very finely chopped parsley and serve.
