Body Recovered Sunday

The body of Hart was recovered late yesterday in a shallow eddy of San Francisco Bay about a mile from the San Mateo-Hayward bridge over which Thurmond and Holmes, according to their confession, hurled it after they had bludgeoned the unfortunate youth into insensibility, trussed up his arms with wire and weighted his feet with concrete blocks.
