### Mineral Production For Year In British Columbia Will Be Two Million Dollars Ahead

VANCOUVER, Nov. 16: (CP)—Despite a decline during the first six months of the year, British Columbia mines made such strides since June that the total production for 1933 will top that of 1932 by almost \$2,000,000 in value, it was predicted yesterday by J. D. Galloway, provincial mineralogist, in speaking before the western meeting of the Canadian Institute of Mining and Metallurgy and the Mining Association of British Columbia.

The increase is being accounted for largely by gold production which is expected to be fifteen percent ahead of 1932 in value. There will be a slight decrease in silver and zinc production while the lead output shows a slight improvement.
