### WOMEN AND MARRIAGE

#### The "Marrying for Money" Problem as Seen by a Woman

"How," says Mrs. Francis Graham, "can the average penniless woman, 'deceitful of heart,' naturally, according to the Scriptures, ignorant of logic and ethics, but a past-graduate in poverty, hope to truly distinguish between her love for the man himself and her love for his goods and chattels? Look the world over, and you will find that the man of means doesn't go begging afar for a bride.

"How painful to contemplate. Yet this is the position man has thrust upon woman by hedging her in on every hand and preventing her making her own name and place in life, little reckoning that the whole mean system operates against and punishes himself in the end—as it undoubtedly should—for how could woman do man a deeper wrong than to marry him for his money?

"It is useless to deny that one great cause of discontent in marriage is that woman's financial condition has not kept pace with her mental development; and if woman is dissatisfied how can man be happy? Her predicament reacts upon him every time. It cannot, and should not be otherwise. Indeed, his unhappiness doubtless yet will be the corduroy road upon which she will march to final emancipation.

### Strawberry Cream

Over a quart of strawberries pour one teacupful of sugar, let stand for an hour, then rub through a sieve or fruit press. Soak one tablespoonful of gelatine in one-quarter pint of cold water for an hour, then add a cup of boiling water and a little sugar. Stir until the ingredients are thoroughly dissolved. Set aside, and when cool add the strained strawberries. Pour into pretty moulds or large bowl and set on ice to chill until ready for use. Any other fruit may be substituted for strawberries with equally good results. Oranges prepared this way are just splendid.

### Tell the Boys

One of the most satisfactory ways to hasten the cure of mosquito bites or of bites of other insects, or of cold sores, is to open the skin over the sore so as to let the poisoned fluid escape. Then the affected spot is really only a wound and is susceptible to treatment with antiseptics and healing lotions.

### Curtain Hint

Make your curtains with hems of equal length at top and bottom. After washing them hang them inside down, slipping the rod through what was before the bottom hem. This equalizes wear and tear and prolongs their life. Be careful not to make such curtains of a material whose figures are not reversible in position.

### Washing White Gloves

A good way to wash white silk gloves; Rub them well in lukewarm water to which a little ammonia has been added, and

rinse quickly in clear water of the same temperature. Hang them where they will dry rapidly, and then put them between sheets of white paper and under a weight. Treated in this way they will not turn yellow.

## ITEMS OF SPORT

President Barrow of the Eastern league, has released Umpires Rudderham, Nannon, Black and Pender. Rudderham goes to the Southern league, and Pender goes to the Virginia league.

Bill Squires will return to the ring, having agreed to meet Bill Lang in Sydney next month. When the pair met a year ago Lang gave Squires an awful beating.

Joe Sugden, former Vancouver backstop, ex-big league player, trainer and minor league manager, is spending a few weeks in the South. Rumor has it that he is scouting for one of the National league clubs in the southern circuit.

Alfred Lequesne, a bowler of national reputation, was killed by lightning at Royalton, Ohio. With his wife he was in a hammock under a tree, when the bolt struck him, killing him instantly. His wife fell to the ground unconscious, but was not injured. Lequesne was a member of the Bond team of Cleveland, which broke the world's record at the Buffalo international tournament last winter. He was 42 years old.

Jimmy Williams of the Victoria club is a full-blooded Hawaiian and learned the game in St. Louis College, Honolulu. His work in the island game attracted the attention of American players over there and he was recommended to and signed by Charley Graham of the Sacramento club, who turned the big, dark-skinned fellow over to Householder. Williams has all the earmarks of a promising young pitcher, both speed and curves.

Except signing the articles, everything has been arranged for a match between Jack Johnson and Bombardier Wells for the biggest purse ever offered in Great Britain. Johnson is to receive \$30,000, win, lose or draw. The sum of \$15,000 is to be deposited July 15 and the other \$15,000 is to be handed to Johnson an hour before the contest, which is to take place in London, probably in September.

A new track record for six furlongs was hung up in the big race at Minon Park the fourth event at six furlongs. Pride of Lismore, which is at the top of his form right now, stood the rest of the field of five on their heads when he stepped the three-quarters of the mile in 1:12 3-5, two-fifths of a second better than the old mark, held by Fancy. Daddy Gip was a length and a half behind the winner, while Thistle Belle nosed Ada Meade out of the show money. Jessup burn was left at the post and was outrun all the way, though he closed stoutly.
