**MR. BENNETT'S POSITION**

A correspondent wants to know what is the position of Premier Bennett in relation to President Beatty's campaign to bring about the absorption of the Canadian National Railways into the Canadian Pacific system, involving the abandonment of something like five thousand miles of railway of which sixty-six percent would be Canadian National.

Our reply is that we do not know but we can tell him what was the Prime Minister's attitude in 1930 as expressed in a speech made by him in the city of Winnipeg from which the following paragraph is taken:

"I say to you that no man in this country rejoices more in the strength and progress of the Canadian National Railways than I, made possible as it was in the first instance by the genius of our own statesmen and by the passing of legislation by our party. But more, every effort of mine after July 28 will be for one purpose. That purpose is not only to preserve the identity of the Canadian National Railways as a publicly owned competitor of a private enterprise, but to see that it serves even better and more effectively the Canadian people, who are so proud of it."

## SPORT CHAT

Toronto Maple Leafs put on another of their heart-straining last minute comebacks in Toronto Saturday night to defeat Montreal Maroons for their fourth straight victory without a defeat since the opening of the National Hockey League season. It was a hard fought game, particularly in the last two periods, featured by a great deal of roughness with fights and arguments, resulting in a number of players being put off the ice. The Maroons put up as good a game as the Maple Leafs. Goalies Alex Connell, Maroons, and George Hainsworth, Maple Leafs, had a busy evening with many narrow escapes and spectacular saves. About four minutes before the end of the game, Lionel Conacher, star Maroon defence man, was knocked cold in an accidental collision with Jack Kilrea. He was carried unconscious from the ice and could not finish the game which was held up a few minutes on account of the incident.

The Maroons scored the first goal eight minutes and fifteen seconds after the start of the second period when Billep slammed the puck into the net from a scramble in front of the goal. Six minutes after the start of the third period, Harold Cotton, on a pass from Blair in a scramble in front of the Montreal net, evened it up for Toronto. The great Charlie Conacher scored the winning goal with five and a quarter minutes to go on a pass from Happy Day behind the net. It was a hot one just over the line.

Sunday night the Maple Leafs went to Chicago and blanked the Black Hawks three to nil for their fifth victory so far this season without a defeat.

The Boston Bruins and Detroit Red Wings blanked the St. Louis Eagles and Montreal Canadiens respectively Saturday night to move into a tie with the Black Hawks for leadership of the American section. The New York Rangers, by defeating St. Louis Sunday night, moved into even terms with the Eagles for fourth place.
