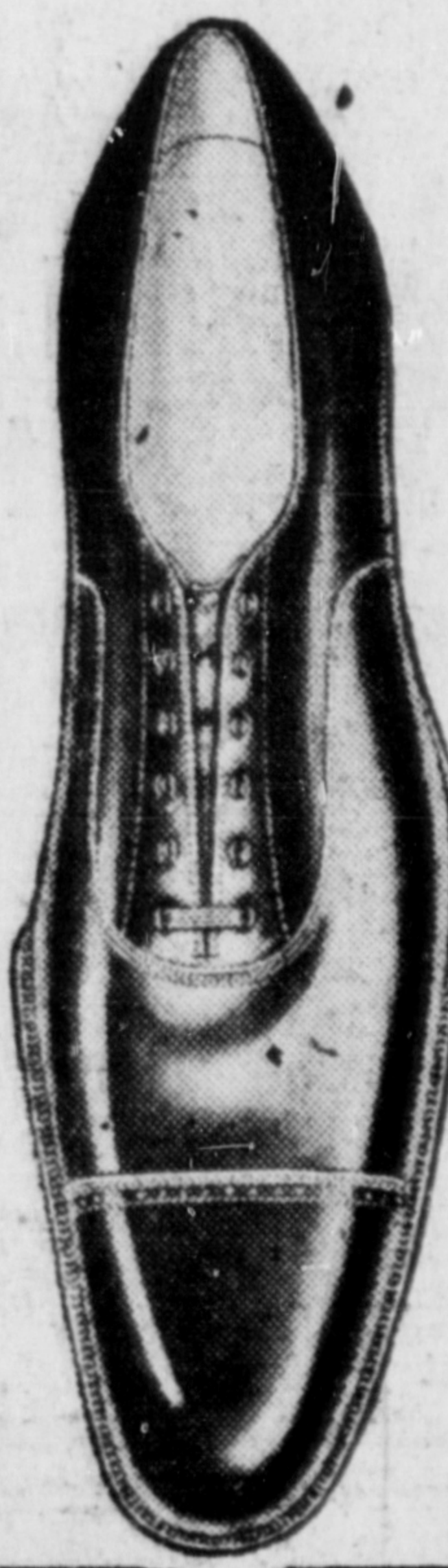

ciation, declared that a foolish step was being taken by the government in authorizing the reduction of interest rates on existing bonded indebtedness of all municipalities. The effect will be, he stated, to seriously damage the credit of the municipalities.

In expressing the opposition of the British Columbia Bond Dealers' Association to the government's refunding proposals, Mr. Fraser stated that the bondholders were willing to compromise but he claimed that arrangements should be made by direct negotiation between themselves and the municipalities and not through government intervention. The association has formally approved a compromise suggested for the City of Prince Rupert.

Mr. Fraser, president, and Hugh Allan, vice-president of the British Columbia Bond Dealers' Association, have been named a delegation to interview the minister of finance, Hon. John Hart, on the matter.

Ald. J. J. Miller, chairman of the civic finance committee of Vancouver, said that Vancouver would not repudiate its bonds. He was not in favor of a drastic reduction in interest rates except by mutual agreement of the bondholders.
