ELECTRONS IN SESSION

Ontario Hydro System Largest in World—Cobourg Mayor Withdraws—Lampless Cars Predicted

TORONTO, Feb. 3.—F. C. Elliott of Ingersoll, addressing the Municipal Electric Association in convention here, maintained that the present organization was now incapable of handling the hydro-electric organization which is the largest public utility in the world.

Mayor Jack Delaney of Cobourg, after a heated argument, left the Yellow Room in the King Edward Hotel, where the convention was in session, because the place, he claimed, was too small to hold all the delegates.

W. P. Dobson, chief testing engineer of the Ontario Hydro Power Commission, addressing the convention, predicted that illuminated highways would soon be sufficiently well lighted to permit of driving cars without headlights.
